

How much do we refurbish in **Romania and in Croatia?**


Romania: 22% in 2024, 28% over the past 10 years









The Bucharest Architecture Annual, 2019, guided tour explaining the structural problems of the building




Property Ownership and Legal Barriers:

- Complex ownership structures (public - central and local, and private)


- Disputes over ownership rights (1991-2025 onwards)

- Unclear property limits and diffuse responsibility (constant negotiations of use)

Magheru - Brătianu Boulevard a modernising axis of the city







Magheru - Brătianu Boulevard

considered a benchmark of modern interwar architecture in Bucharest – and perhaps throughout Romania – a synthesis of it, through the quality of the buildings, the notoriety of the architects and the architectural and urban unity of the ensemble (N. Lascu, architectural historian)





Technical and Structural Barriers:

- Building age and condition

- Small spaces by design

- Lack of skilled workforce

Social and Cultural Barriers:

- Low awareness of benefits

- Social acceptance and Denial of risks

- Resistance to change

- Reluctance towards collaboration

- Unstable construction costs





Multi-helix collaboration mechanisms to support artists take on underused spaces and turn them into cultural destinations in the city

Advocacy for Urban Rooms / Urban Living Labs for multi-actor involvement and integrated approach to the built environment



Disconnect between policy intentions and practical implementation Power imbalances and funding limitations Conflicting visions of development (community vs. commercial)



Top-down: European policies emphasizing sustainability, resilience, and heritage preservation

Grassroots perspective: Community-driven efforts, local knowledge, social inclusion

Order of Architects of Romania - OAR: a connector that empowers grassroots initiatives while aligning with European policy and goals

Key approach:

Mediate between grassroots initiatives and top-down policy frameworks

Facilitate dialogue among architects, policymakers, investors, and community groups

Funding mechanism:

The architectural stamp duty tax (0.05% of the investment value of projects requiring architectural services) supports initiatives that enhance architectural and urban culture, including adaptive reuse projects, heritage conservation efforts, and experimental urban interventions

Annual calls for projects that align with public interest and architectural culture, fostering collaboration between civic actors and authorities.
